1 Ten Days Quick Learning Methodologies Training KK Teachers.



Ten days TOT in functional literacy was arranged at KK Head office Peshawar. The purpose of the training was to prepare a group of community trainers among the teaching community to train other teachers in lesson planning, phonetic methods of teaching, quick learning methodologies; building upon the learners already gained knowledge, involving learners in teaching/learning process and making low cost learning material.

Teachers from Jamrud, Karak, Mardan, Peshawar and FR Peshawar actively participated in the training. Training was conducted by Ms. Nasra Habib from Khoj and her assistant using their research based methodology of quick learning techniques.

Life Skills Sessions at FR Peshawar

Life skill sessions have been arranged at various literacy centers of FR Peshawar. The process was very interactive, learners took keen interest. They actively participated in discussion and shared their knowledge based on their experiences. Usually topics of these sessions are: Common Values, Attitude, Accidents and precautionary measures, balanced diet, Women and health, Cleanliness, Rights and Responsibilities, Communication, Stress



management, Time Management etc. Women feedback regarding the health issues and cleanliness was that they are now more aware regarding the health issues. Very small precaution can save us from serious health problems. Similarly, they got aware regarding their rights, which they were not knowing before. They feel confident to raise their voice for their right at various levels.

Time management is another issue, women face in their daily routine chores; and usually feel overburdened and depressed. Time management session has given them an insight how to organize themselves, so the work can be managed properly and time can be utilized effectively.

Medical Camp in Tabi Khwa, Karak

RO Karak organized medical camp at village Tabi Khwa under the project of Rogh Sehat (Better Health) funded by FROK. The village is situated 15 km from the Karak Headquarter. It is hilly and backward area. The inhabitants of this village are deprived of the basic facilities especially health, as there is no hospital no doctor except two lady health workers. KK team visited the village and conducted meetings with Women Organization and Men Organization during these meetings organization members passed resolution and requested KK to arrange a medical camp.



Karak regional staff purchased medicines after disease identification in the village during the field visits and conducted a meeting with Health department for provision of technical support in medical camp. Executive District Officer (health) provided medical doctor Dr. Sadiquallah and Lady Health visitor Ms. Shaheen, conducted medical camp on 18th May 2010. 213 patient were checked during the camp in which 140 were female, 35 were children and 31 were male. Free medicines were also provided to the patients after thorough check up. Two eye patients were referred to Karak Development Area Hospital. Women and men organization took interest and worked with enthusiasm during the whole day medical camp.

Colour Scheming for damaged Schools, Basic Health Units and Furniture at Dir

Due to terroristic activities and military operation, schools, hospitals and infra structure got damaged. There is a fear prevailing all around in Dir and Swat. Children are very much disturbed to see their damaged schools.



Khwendu Kor has been working on Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) project for repairing of damaged school and Basic Health Unit in Upper Dir since April 2010. KK PPAF Project Manager, Mr. Jamshed Khan, and KK

Regional Manager Dir, Mr. Ibrash Pasha requested Graphic Designer, Miraj Khan for color scheming of the Schools, Basic Health Units and furniture to create attraction among children and the people living around. In this concern visits were made to 25 schools, 17 Basic Health Unit and different villages in Upper Dir, lower Dir in three days where pictures of the damaged schools were taken. The surroundings and the environment of these areas was viewed to choose colors for Schools and Basic Health Units. Sketches were also made for gardens in many schools. After the field visits, drawings and pictures of colors scheming for Schools, Basic Health Unit and designing for furniture was done and was sent to RM Dir, and Project Manager, They highly appreciated the entire work and started with implementing the color scheme.

② Four Hundred Women of FR Facilitated at Door Step for CNIC.

FAFEN Project Staff conducted seven male and female community meetings in all four tribes of the FR Peshawar during the month of May.

The aim of these meetings was to ensure the community regarding the basic Democratic Governance Program of FAFEN and to ensure the KK roles in that project, CRG Youth Core Group formation and its membership forms filling, handovering the 400 formed women CNIC at door steps, Location identification of the CNIC / Voters registration, duplicate Voters registration, IDPs in the FR Peshawar, insecurity in the area, Political and Electoral violence, importance of CNIC, Voter registration, future strategy for the CRG, role of Public and Elected representatives, community response towards Khwendu Kor and FAFEN respectively.



As the tribal women in FR Peshawar are not allowed to go out of their homes and cover a distance of more than 50km to NADRA office except in rare cases. The community demanded for a mobile van. So, in this concern FAFEN Project Staff arranged a five days mobile van camps for forming CNICs.

FAFEN staff collected them from NADRA and further gave to CRG Members. CRG member distributed CNICs of 400 women on door step and the tokens after distribution amongst women were submitted to NADRA. Community of FR Peshawar highly appreciated Khwendo Kor and FAFEN staff for the the support and facilitation.

Public forum D.I. Khan

Public forum was organized at DI Khan NA 24 by FAFEN project staff. Speakers of the forum were Assistant Election Commissioner D.I.Khan, Assistant Manager NADRA and lawyer of DI Khan District Bar. Programme Manager welcomed the participants and gave a brief introduction of FAFEN and Khwendo Kor. Purpose of the Forum was to aware the constituents about the process of National ID Cards and Vote registration. More then 50 people from different walks of life participated in the forum.

The Assistant Election Commissioner Muhammad Aslam briefed the participants about Vote registration criteria and urged on the importance of vote registration and requested the youngsters to play active role in the community to register as much votes as possible.

Mr. Nayyer Zaman Baloch Assistant Manager NADRA was the second speaker of the forum. He briefed the participants about history and functions of NADRA and said that it started working in 2001. More then six lacks CNICs have been issued to the residents of Distt. D.I.Khan and total nine crore in Pakistan. He briefed the participants about the CNIC registration process. To avoid double registration the attesting officers should check the documents care fully and then sign he further added. In 2009 one lakh and six thousand individuals had been register and in 2010 NADRA will try to register as many as possible he added.



CRG (Constituency Relationship Group) Meeting, Karak

On 13 May 2010 K.K regional office Karak conducted meeting of 20 village Organizations, members regarding Constituency Relationship Group Formation .In the meeting 20 representatives of organizations took participation. Khwendo Kor staff facilitated the participant regarding Awaz-e-Huq project and CRG. Facilitators described the CRG objectives which are as under:

- To maintain public interaction with decision makers,
- To carry out sustain advocacy for basic human rights especially with respect to women and children.

The participants took keen interest in the CRG and they filled membership forms for the group and also selected president and secretary for the process in future. They also expressed issues regarding Education, Health, NADRA, Election commission and other human rights related departments that they are not honest in their job responsibility. So it was decided that the strategies will be formed for the reforms of these departments in the next meetings. They also threw light on arranging meetings with elected bodies of district Karak that they pay their role for the human rights especially for women and children rights.



③ Wheat Plots Production Data Collection, R.O Karak

Visits have been paid to villages Metha Khel , Talab Khel , Biland Kalla, Zebi Kalla , Dab , Kando Khel and EssaQ Chontra regarding collection of wheat production data and collected all the production data from the farmers. Mostly farmers were unhappy with wheat plots. They said that due to no rain and load shading we could not achieve the target. This year the rainfall ratio was low and load shading was a big problem.



Farmers faced many problems, Despite all these problems the Agriculture Department procured the wheat seeds from some of farmers in chontra valley which were certified by agriculture department . These farmers were from Metha Khel village in which M. Idrees sold wheat of Rs. 30,500/, Farid Ullah Khan sold wheat of Rs 8300 / , Waqar Ahmad sold wheat of Rs 8925/ and Mumtaz sold wheat seed of Rs. 17,500/-

Coordination / Gender Training Refresher Meeting

Coordination/ Gender training refresher meeting was held on May14th , 2010. Five men and four women participated in this meeting. Ms. Sobia (P.M) gave orientation on NCA project, its goals, objective and duration with CFC male and female facilitators and urged upon the need to work properly and fully in coordination with their line managers for the fulfillment of the project objectives and target and achieve within the set time frame. P.M also enlightened the project that NCA is based on awareness of Human Rights especially focused on women rights of inheritance and consent in marriages. P.M discussed in detail responsibilities of CFC and CFC facilitators. She gave a refresher on gender such as definition of gender and shared flow chart with them.



Cluster Discussion Meeting With Community Organization

Regional office Mansehra conducted eight Cluster discussion meetings on 04/05/2010 and 27/05/2010. Sixty nine female and seventy six male of (Serian, Malik pur, Baffa Khawja kheli , Neemshera, Kurmang chanara Hearh and Saloona) from community organizations participated in the meeting.

The aim of the meetings was to raise awareness on Rights and Gender Based violence Issues.
